### **[Day 01] Madrid → Zaragoza (320 km)**

Make your own way to the meeting point area at Plaza de España (at least 15 minutes before the appointed time). Tour begins with an orientation tour around the capital of Spain, passing through the Cibeles Fountain to arrive and visit Plaza Mayor, Piazza di Spagna, Plaza de Colón as well as The Royal Palace of Madrid which was built on the site of the former Alcazar Castle and is not the official residence of the King of Spain, but rather where state ceremonies, official banquets as well as other state functions take place. Continue on to Puerta del Sol, a historic semi-circular city square which houses the well-known "Kilometre Zero", a stone slab on the pavement which marks the radial network of Spain's 6 National Roads. Enjoy a little shopping for some specialty leather goods, clothing as well as traditional Spanish souvenirs at the square; before heading over to Zaragoza, the capital as well as political and administrative centre of the Autonomous Community of Aragon.

### **[Day 02] Zaragoza → Barcelona (300 km)**

In the morning, we'll drive directly to the charming coastal city of Barcelona to visit Columbus Monument, La Rambla and followed by Sagrada Familia, a famous landmark and unfinished emblematic temple designed by Catalan architect Antoni Gaudi. Gaudi's vivid colours and unique fairy tale design elements is throughout the city and makes the place feel like a fantasy in the artist's mind. Thereafter, it's on to Camp Nou, a football stadium and home of FC Barcelona since its completion in 1957; and followed by a visit to Estadi Olímpic Lluís Companys, the main stadium for the 1992 Summer Olympic, which is located in Montjuïc, a prominent hill to the southwest of the city centre and overlooking the harbour. Enjoy some free time to explore and perhaps, do some shopping around the bustling Plaça de Catalunya.

### **[Day 03] Barcelona → Valencia → Alicante (525 km)**

Leave Barcelona for Valencia, the third largest and one of the oldest cities in Spain. Thanks to its geographical location, Valencia has historically been considered as Spain's main gateway to the Mediterranean and is with commercially as well as culturally rich with Moorish and Arab customs. Upon arrival, visit Plaza del Ayuntamiento, Valencia's Ancient City Gates as well as Valencia Cathedral where one of the surviving Holy Chalice is preserved. At the end of the tour, the day is rounded off with a drive into Alicante.

### **[Day 04] Alicante → Granada → Málaga (485 km)**

Today your voyage will take you to the city of Granada on the plateau of the Andalusia province, a historic city that has been ruled by the Romans, Visigoths as well as the Moors and became the last stronghold for the Arab Dynasty during its eight-hundred-year-long rule in the Iberian Peninsula. Visit UNESCO World Heritage Site Alhambra, a spectacular Moorish citadel and palace atop a hill overlooking Granada in Southern Spain. Also known as the Red Palace, it is considered as a place where Moorish art as well as architecture reached their pinnacle and is certainly the culmination and grand finale of medieval Islamic culture on the Iberian Peninsula. Continue on to the historic and culturally rich provincial capital of Málaga, on Costa del Sol, the sunniest region in Spain. Literally the "Coast of the Sun", the region sees more than 320 sunny days each year and is famous for its golden sandy beaches as well as secluded villas. Málaga is the birthplace of the famous Spanish artist, Pablo Picasso.

### **[Day 05] Malaga → Seville (210 km)**

Head northwest to Seville, the capital and the largest city of the autonomous community of Andalusia. The guardian angel of traditional Andalusian culture, Seville is also the birthplace of the passionate flamenco dance as well as is the primary setting of many operas, the best known of which is Bizet's Carmen. First stop of the day is the Seville Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the largest Gothic cathedral in the world. Built on the site of the grand Almohad Mosque with its medieval minaret now converted into a bell tower, the cathedral houses the final resting place of the city's conqueror and his descendant as well as the tomb of Christopher Columbus. Thereafter, wander over to another UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Alcázar of Seville, a royal palace that was originally a Moorish fort and it is by and large considered to be one of the greatest surviving examples of mudéjar architecture although Islamic, Gothic, Renaissance as well as Baroque elements can be found. The upper levels of the Alcázar are still used by the royal family as their official Seville residence, regularly hosting state officials as well as dignitaries. From here onwards, enjoy a walking tour through the picturesque Santa Cruz to Torre del Oro, a dodecagonal military watchtower; and the beautiful Maria Luisa Park, home to the majestic Plaza de España. Designed especially for the 1929 Ibero-American Exposition, Seville's Plaza de España is a Spanish architectural marvel with Art Deco, Mudéjar and Renaissance Revival influences. If time permits, you may opt to include an excursion to Mijas, a sophisticated but charming traditional mountain village.

### **[Day 06] Seville → Lisbon (460 km)**

Enjoy the changing scenery as we continue northwest towards Lisbon, Portugal's hilly, coastal capital city which is often referred to as "The City of Seven Hills"; where we expected to arrive at Cabo da Roca, a cape that forms the westernmost point of Continental Europe, in the afternoon. See the rugged Atlantic coast with its dramatic cliffs overlooking sandy beaches a dizzying 100 meters below. Don't forget to buy a personalized certificate to commemorate your visit and to take away as a souvenir too! On arrival at Lisbon city centre, visit the iconic Belém Tower and the nearby Jerónimos Monastery. Both classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Belém Tower was built to commemorate Vasco da Gama's expedition and is a reminder of the great maritime discoveries that laid the foundations of the modern world while Jerónimos Monastery is a prime example of Manueline architecture, a style unique to Portugal that combines Flamboyant Gothic, Moorish and early Renaissance influences. Enjoy some free time to explore the bustling Rossio Square on your own and those interested can take the opportunity to sample authentic Portuguese custard tarts at the century-old bakery.

**[Day 07] Lisbon → Toledo → Madrid (675 km)**

Sit back and enjoy the rich palette of colours in natural surroundings as we drive back to Madrid via the Historic City of Toledo. Known as the "City of Three Cultures", this ancient city sits majestically above the Tagus River and contains extensive cultural as well as monumental heritage of several historic civilizations. Stroll across the city through its narrow, cobbled streets with the iconic Alcázar of Toledo dominating its skyline and visit the grand Toledo Cathedral, an impressive example of medieval Gothic architecture laden with elaborate wrought-iron work, lavish wood carvings, and window after colourful window of 500-year-old stained glass; before continuing on your north bound journey back to Madrid where the tour will conclude on arrival at Plaza de España.
